and a family doctor to pursue the career. He completed his Family Practice Residency at the University of Utah. Diane received her B.S. at the University of Washington in Medical Technology.



In January, the foundation funded the Headache School in conjunction with the University of Utah Neurology Department, offering training, support groups and education.













